Linda will share this information with the congregation. She also wanted to mention that we collected \$212.97 at the last noisy offering for the relief in Texas.

- 1. February ended with a deficit of (\$1,457) vs. a budgeted surplus of \$46. The shortfall was due to lower envelopes, offset by higher Thrivent Choice dollars. Edeposits were on budget. Expenses were also on budget. For the year, we are about \$2,500 below budget on net income. Again, lower envelope revenue is the driver. Other income is at or above budget, and expenses are below budget.

- 4. Sim Sound recommended that one of the choir mies be directed up to the organ pipes which helps decrease that organ sounding so loud compared to vocalists while in the balcony

Lent.

- Wednesday night Lenten services. Using the Holden format. Congregants can checkout Holden song booklets from church office. We are unable to post online/make copies.

Holy week.

- 1. *Maundy Thursday*. Worship service traditionally 1st communion. This year's class will be combined 5th and 6th graders due to last year's Covid-19 situation preventing gatherings; 16 families; plan to limit the service attendees to pt communion families only. Families were asked to RSVP. We are still at a 50% capacity limit in the sanctuary.
- 2. *Palm Sunday*. Pr. Linda will order some palm branches. The number of kids in Sunday school is increasing. Perhaps they can share a song.
- 3. Good Friday. Pastor Linda will plan something.
- 4. *Easter*. We will have one service. In-person/Facebook with Communion (Upon exiting service and Drive thru). No Easter breakfasts. Preparedness team will need to meet and go over plan.

j. Youth & Family:

i. Jessica mentioned that she was hoping to do some church clean-up with the youth sometime in April in the yard. This would likely be for the older kids. She also was thinking of doing a fishing outing in May for all ages and had a few options for possible locations. She was also thinking a possible camp out in the church lawn in May. This would likely be for 5th grades and up. Another option that she was thinking of was doing a river cleanup day and maybe a hayride or bowling day with other area church youth groups. Lastly, she got some information from the La Crosse Loggers about doing a church outing day at the ball field. We can get packages of 12 tickets for \$60.  - i. The available funds for each bucket are as follows for 2021:
 - 1. SE MN/Local \$1.114
 - 2. Global/World \$11,380
 - 3. Youth and Family \$6,573
 - 4. Building \$6,199
 - ii. Pr. Linda made a suggestion at last month's council meeting that we give the money from our local mission bucket to the Valley View Healthcare and Rehab Foundation. They are in desperate need of a new transportation van and they were unable to hold their regular fundraiser last year and will be holding an online auction this year in conjunction with the Houston Community Foundation. This affects not only our community, but many of our congregation members as well. Pr. Linda would like us to be able to make a donation directly to the foundation instead of waiting for the auction to help pay for their new van.
 - 1. Pr. Linda made a motion to designate the available funds from the local mission bucket of \$1,114 directly to the VVHR Foundation to go towards a purchase of their new van. Ellen Hongerholt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
 - iii. Lastly, Pr. Linda wanted to encourage all council members to think of ideas for ways we can designate the funds from our other buckets. We have over \$11,000 available in our world mission fund. This could make a huge difference for someone or something There aren't any set parameters for where these funds can be designated too, but just as long as it's a global mission. If people have ideas, please bring them to council for discussion. All options can be discussed.
